She runs several businesses, including Honey Bear Petroleum and Petroleum, Inc., and is a director of Garvey Industries. She established a coalition of artists and art companies in Calgary, Alberta, and founded one of Canada's largest ballet companies before returning to Wichita and devoting her energies to the arts in her hometown. Today, Ann serves as president of Ballet Wichita. She is an active member of the Mid-America Arts Alliance, Wichita State University Fine Arts Advisory Board, Wichita Art Museum, Art-sPartners, Wichita Center for the Arts, Music Theatre of Wichita, Tallgrass Film Festival, Kansas African American Museum, and Kansas Arts Commission. In 2002 Ann received both the Governor's Art Award for Philanthropy and the WSU Art Patron Award. Ann earned her bachelor's degree in theater from Wichita State University. She has one son, Tristan Garvey Fair. Ann is a third-generation patron. Her mother, **Jean**, was named a patron in 1992 and her grandmother, **Olive**, became a patron in 1968.

Bonnie Bing Honeyman has been a staff writer for The Wichita Eagle since 1980. She is known for her weekly fashion column, weekly "Happenings" column, seasonal fashion sections published three times a year and her annual reports from fashion shows in New York and Dallas. Bonnie is also a long-time volunteer for C.A.S.A. (Court Appointed Special Advocates).
